The City of Edmonton is exploring a Vision Zero Street Lab in Allard after hearing about street safety concerns in the area. Vision Zero Street Labs use adaptable traffic calming measures to address traffic safety concerns such as unsafe speeds, shortcutting, and pedestrian safety.

The City would like to explore residents' perspectives and gain insights into their lived experiences and traffic safety concerns. City staff will use these learnings to determine if a Street Lab is needed for your neighbourhood.

We want to hear from people who use all modes of transportation to get around the city. This is where we need your help!

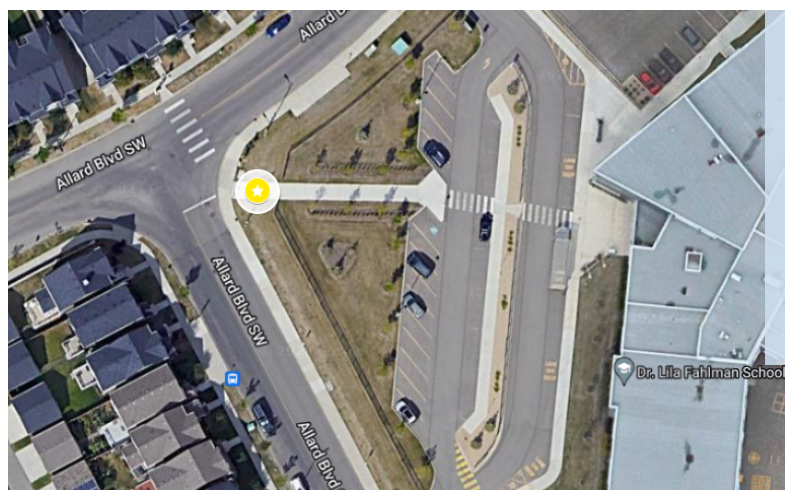
